## Avoiding Triumphant Christianity

For Christians, the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is the pinnacle moment in all of history. We celebrate this moment every Easter on Resurrection Sunday. Jesus emerges from the now-empty tomb leaving his grave clothes behind. *"The last great enemy to be destroyed is death,"* the Apostle Paul says, *"for God has put everything under his feet."* (1 Cor 15:26-27) The resurrection is a moment of victory over evil, death, and darkness.

In the midst of this great celebration, however, we tend to forget that it was a <u>crucified</u> body that was resurrected. In a book called *The Crucified God*, theologian Jurgen Moltmann explains,

> He died 'for us', to give us, 'the dead', a share in his new life of resurrection and in his future of eternal life. His resurrection is the content of the significance of his death on the cross 'for us' because **the risen Christ is himself the crucified Christ.** (p. 182, emphasis added)

What does this mean? Separating the cross of Jesus from the resurrection of Jesus is impossible and without his suffering and cross, the resurrection would be a mere party trick. Jesus' death was not unlike others who had died on Roman crosses. But the meaning of Jesus' death was unique in that it proved God's love for us. Romans 5:6-8 says,

> For at just the right time, while we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God proves His love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

The resurrection has meaning because it is not only a victory but a vindication for the work of salvation on the cross for all those who believe. Jesus presented himself to the doubting disciple, Thomas, not as a perfected body, but as one riddled with scars. Jesus said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and look at my hands. Put your hand into the wound in my side. Don't be faithless any longer. Believe!" (John 20:27)

"Triumphant Christianity" avoids and forgets the cross and seeks vindication on its own terms. It forgets the humble Jesus, who was as Isaiah says, *"He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering." Is. 53:1 The suffering crucified Christ, was crucified for us and he is also risen indeed, for us! And because of this we also can be encouraged that in our suffering and pain and loss, our resurrection we will be all the more victorious in Jesus' name when we are raised with him in glory!* 

Let us avoid "Triumphant Christianity" by remembering that Jesus is with those whom the world deems outcasts and god-forsaken. Let us love and serve like the Lord Jesus himself served. May we too *"have the mind of Christ"*, and *"consider others better than yourself"* (Philippians 2:1-4) Elim, this the true victory of Easter, and the calling and 'triumph' of the Christian life-- may we walk this road together with all humility and grace.




# EASTER 2021


### **ElimKid's Families** RE-EMERGING STRONGER FROM COVID-19

### In the Midst of a Lost Generation

Would you like to see hundreds, even thousands, of our neighbors in this city come to Jesus?

David Watson, in his book *Contagious Disciple Making*, says that when they started looking at the movements of thousands to Christ that God is doing around the world right now, they noticed a critical element: a PRAYER movement precedes every Disciple-Making Movement.

There are two sides to this prayer: first, we must become people of prayer. Second, we need to mobilize people to pray.

Of course, I won't pray unless I am a disciple —an obedient disciple of Jesus—not because others think so, but because I love Jesus more than anything.

How do we need to change? Re-arrange our schedule, our priorities? Cut the unnecessary, the wasting, the busywork? I need one hour or two hours! So, say I begin. I talk to God; I listen to God. I ask him how he feels about my day, my movie, my book. What do you think, God? I listen. Here's another side to it. David was impelled to change his approach to prayer. First, instead of asking people to pray for him, he decided to pray for them. There are thirty days on the calendar. He decided to call one friend each day, ask how he could pray for them, and then pray on the spot if they had time. Or he would text or email, writing out the prayer.

Let's try it!

Or what else is God showing you?


May you bless this baby with a deep and abiding love for you, O Lord...
